More Horse Trivia Facts:

- ♦ Curlin, the top money-earning Thoroughbred racehorse of all time, earned an astonishing \$10,501,800 throughout his 16-start career. The almost undefeated Zenyatta, is the highest earning female racehorse, ranking 9th overall with career earnings of \$7,304,580. The highest ranking foreign racehorse on the list is #4, a Brazilian Thoroughbred named Gloria de Campeao, who earned \$9,258,355. Horses work hard for their money!
- ♦ One of the most famous fictional horses of all time, The Black Stallion (a wild Arabian in the book series), was played primarily by Arabian stallion Cass Ole in the original film. In the 1990's TV series, however, his main portrayer was a well-known Quarter Horse, Doc's Keepin' Time ("Justin"), who also played Black Beauty in the 1994 movie adaptation of the novel.
